Catalog Description: Volumes and surface area of solids of revolution. Lengths of curves. The logarithm and exponential functions. Techniques of integration. Areas in polar coordinates. Improper integrals, infinite series, and power series.

Course Objectives: The student will develop the skills necessary to disassemble and synthesize functions which she has formerly approached from an intuitive standpoint.

You may ask assistance from each other, tutors, or anyone else. Pledge problems must be done alone, though you may ask me for help if you get stuck. Only the pledge problems will be submitted and graded. Assignments will be considered late if not submitted by 9:30 am on the weekday following the official due date. You will be penalized at least 10% for a late assignment.

Most homework assignments will be completed electronically, but a few will be completed on paper. Paper assignments should be neat, well organized, and multiple pages must be stapled.
